

MAINTENANCE SUPPORT TECHNICIAN PATHWAY PROGRAM

CPC20220 Certificate II in Construction Pathways – Building Maintenance (AC61)

Delivered in partnership with BHP, the Maintenance Support Technician - Construction Pathway Program at South Metropolitan TAFE's (SM TAFE) Rockingham campus provides entry level participants with the required skills to gain employment in Western Australia's resources industry. Students will be employed with Programmed whilst completing units selected to suit the role of a Maintenance Support Technician with BHP in the Pilbara region. The role performs general maintenance duties alongside trade professionals.

Classes will be held at SM TAFE's Rockingham campus in a supportive and applied learning environment. BHP is offering fully funded, paid training scholarships to selected applicants, with an opportunity for employment in Maintenance Support Technician roles at the conclusion of the Program for those who achieve the course requirements and demonstrate suitability for the role.

COURSE AIMS

The Maintenance Support Technician – Construction Pathway Program offers participants the opportunity to:

1. foster an understanding of the Maintenance Support Technician role
2. develop technical and practical skills linked to the job outcomes
3. learn foundation construction principles, use of tools and materials and conducting work within mining villages
4. be part of a recruitment process conducted by BHP at the conclusion of the program.



COURSE DESCRIPTION

The CPC20220 Certificate II in Construction Pathways – Building Maintenance (AC61) qualification provides a pathway to the primary trades in the construction industry. Units have been aligned with the skills and knowledge required for BHP's Maintenance Support Technicians.

Skills covered during the training are broad and will include at a high level:

- working effectively and sustainably in the construction industry
- WHS requirements, policies and procedures
- use of carpentry tools and materials
- use and handle solid plastering materials
- applying basic levelling procedures and carrying out concreting tasks
- Undertake basic installation of tiles and finishing of plasterboard joints manually

You will also receive your Construction White Card and complete a skills set selected from the TLI20421 Certificate II in Supply Chain Operations including the Forklift licence.

Training will be aligned to the tasks expected of a Maintenance Support Technician with BHP. Participants will obtain basic building maintenance skills and the confidence to work with a range of tasks associated with the role with BHP.

COURSE DETAILS

Course: CPC20220 Certificate II in Construction Pathways – Building Maintenance Pathway

Duration: 16 weeks full-time (four days per week)

Dates: Monday 15th July 2024 – Thursday 31st October 2024

Location: SM TAFE's Rockingham Campus, Simpson Ave, Rockingham

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS

Applicants are required to be either female or of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent (male or female) and must be competent in communication and mathematics. These skills are equivalent to completion of Year 10 but may also be achieved through previous work or informal learning experiences. Applicants should demonstrate a good attitude and work ethic.

The course has been developed to mirror the BHP work environment, with workplace language and policies followed. Participants will complete drug and alcohol screening during the training program. Students will receive support from SM TAFE Student Services and Jobs and Skills engagement officers to provide every opportunity for success.
